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Here is a checklist to ensure your emergency kit is ready when you need it. Your bag should be durable and capable of holding all your essential items. Below are some recommended supplies to help you stay prepared in case of an emergency.

IMPORTANT RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Walk through your home and make a video recording each room & its contents**
- 2. Check to ensure your phone photos/videos are backed up daily**
- 3. Buy an external hard drive and back up your computer and put it in your “Go Bag”**

YOUR EMERGENCY BAG SHOULD INCLUDE

- A list of important contacts & phone numbers**
(assume you can't access your phone)
- A printed list of important passwords**
- Copies of important documents placed in a plastic bag** (passports, ID, marriage, adoption, naturalization & Birth certificates, mortgage statements, bank statements, social security & Medicare Cards, home/auto insurance & health insurance cards, etc)
- Map of the city/county**
- Flashlight with extra batteries**
- Battery operated radio with extra batteries**
- Scissors**
- Duct Tape**
- Work Gloves**
- First aid Kit**
- Whistle**
- Emergency Survival blankets**
- Matches/Lighters**
- Trash Bags** (Can also be worn as RainCoats)
- Face Mask** (N95 the best option)
- Change of Cloths**
- Extra Pair of Eye Glasses**
- Travel Size Toiletries**
- Feminine Care products**
- Roll of Toilet Paper**
- Hand Sanitizer and/or antibacterial wipes**
- Basic Medications** (pain relief, allergy/cold)
- Shelf Stable Food** (protein bars, nuts, instant oatmeal, . etc)
- Water** (Ideally 1 Gallon per person)
- Cash in a plastic bag** (Around \$200 in small bills and some rolls of quarters)

DAY OF EMERGENCY BAG SHOULD INCLUDE

- All your vital prescriptions**
- Pet food, pet bowl, and pet medication**
- Cell phones and chargers**
- Purse/wallet with all credit cards**
- Computer hard drives/thumbdrives**
- Valuables/irreplaceable photos**



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
